

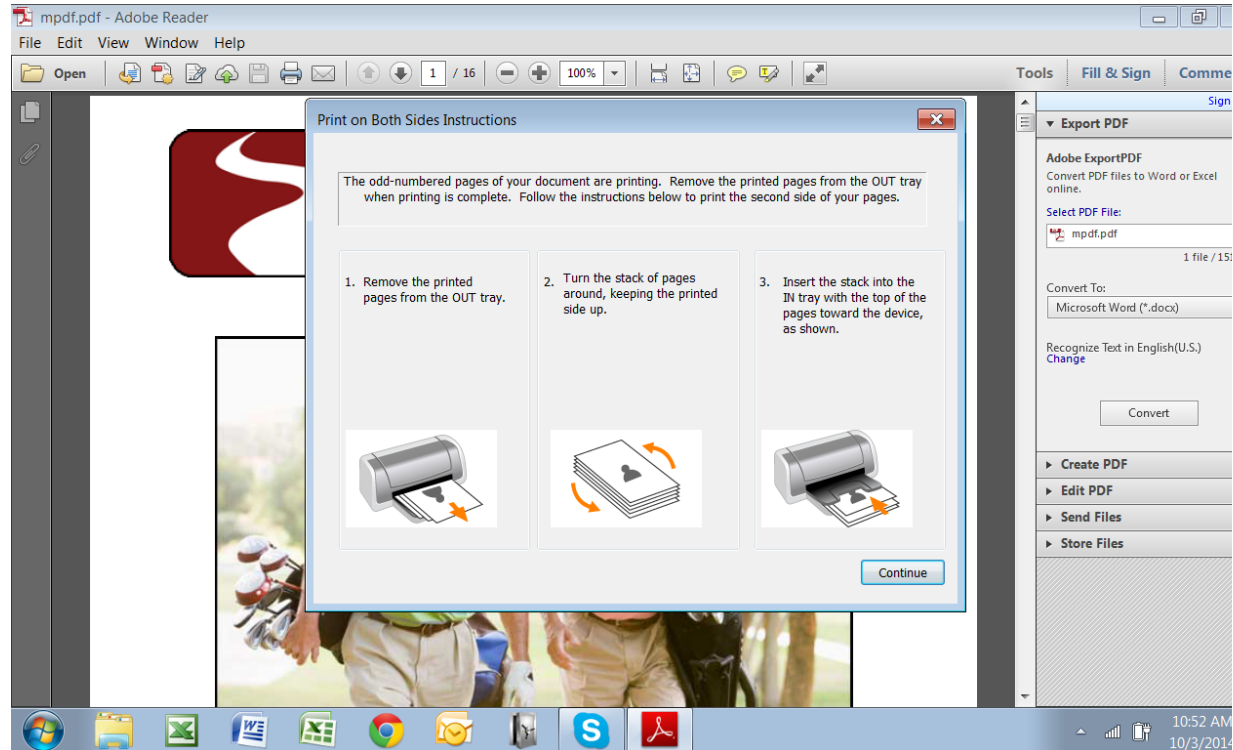
## **TWO METHODS OF PRINTING THE BOOKLET**

### **WINDOWS 7 OPERATING SYSTEM**

**(Each printer could be different)**

#### **A. HOW TO PRINT THE BOOKLET ON TWO SIDED LETTER SIZE PAPER WITH AN HP PHOTOSMART C6180 PRINTER**

- 1. Download the booklet from the web site to your hard drive and then open the file up.**
- 2. Click on print.**
- 3. Set up your printer as follows:**
  - a. Click on Properties and select “Two-sided (Duplex) Printing”**
  - b. Click on “Size”.**
  - c. Put a check mark in “Fit”**
  - d. Put a check mark in “print on both sides of paper” and “Flip on long edge”.**
  - e. Makes sure the Orientation is set to “Portrait”.**
  - f. Now click on Print and it should print 8 pages.**
  - g. You should now see a screen pop up and tell you to (see screen print below:**
    - 1. Remove the printed pages from the OUT tray.**
    - 2. Turn the printed pages end for end, insert the paper stack into the top of the paper tray, printed side up.**
    - 3. Click on continue to print.**

**B. HOW TO PRINT THE BOOKLET (Booklet Style) WITH AN HP PHOTOSMART C6180 PRINTER ON A WINDOWS 7 OPERATING SYSTEM.**

- 1. Download the booklet from the web site to your hard drive and then open the file up.**
- 2. Click on print.**
- 3. Set up your printer as follows:**
  - A. Click on Properties and select “Two-sided (Duplex) Printing”**
  - B. Click on “Booklet”.**
  - C. Make sure the Booklet subset is set on “Both sides”.**

- D. Make sure the Binding is set on “Left”.**
- E. Makes sure the Orientation is set to “Landscape”.**
- F. Now click on Print and it should print 5 pages.**
- G. You should now see a screen pop up and that tells you to (see below):**
- H. Remove the printed pages from the OUT tray.**
- I. Maintaining the same orientation, insert the paper stack into the top of the paper tray, printed side up. (Do not turn the paper at all)**
- J. Click on continue to print.**
- K. Staple the four sheets in the center at the top and bottom**
- L. You may need a long nose stapler to do a good job.**
